Monika Schmid received her PhD in English Linguistics from the University of Düsseldorf, Germany, in 2000, for a PhD thesis on attrition among German-Jewish refugees in the UK and the US. Her thesis was published with John Benjamins Publishing Co. in 2002 under the title *First Language Attrition, Use and Maintenance: The case of German Jews in Anglophone countries*. Her research interests focus on bilingual development and, in particular, on change, deterioration and stability in the native language of migrants who become dominant in the language of the environment. Her recent work focuses on the impact of personal factors such as the age at migration and working memory capacities on these processes. She has been the PI on a number of projects funded by the German Science Foundation (DFG) and the Dutch Organisation for Research (NWO).
